

Peggy and Harvey Manning promise to continue delivering our updated Directory each February, as they have for many years now. We appreciate all of our Neighborhood Association and Neighborhood Watch volunteers and the work they do for our community.

Many thanks to Harvey Manning for his work on our neighborhood signs this month. Not only is he cleaning, repairing and replacing street signs, he has also repainted the letters on our Kingspoint sign at our front entrance. It is now much brighter. Harvey's work is part of our team effort at the neighborhood entrance.

The Neighborhood Association has contracted to have seven trees planted at the entrance in early November, followed by fresh mulch. These trees will grow to screen the pump house again in just a few years. You'll find **details about the renovation** <u>on our website</u>.

We appreciate everyone's patience while we get through this awkward phase of the front entrance renovation. Autumn is the best time for planting new shrubs and trees; so they can establish during the cooler, wetter months of the year. We are waiting to plant this major investment in new trees until summer's heat has passed. Until then, we will do our best to keep the area neat. We expect to have the whole renovation completed before the end of 2018.

Please watch for your 2018 Neighborhood Association brochure, along with detailed information on the front entrance renovation project, soon after Labor Day. We hope you will continue to support the work we do through your membership in the Association. We have applied for a \$500 grant from James City County to help pay for the work at our front entrance. Grants are also available to homeowners who install approved rain gardens to help manage storm water runoff on their properties. You will find details about our October community gathering on *Preserving our Clean Water Heritage* elsewhere in this Crier. Guest speakers will explain how you can take advantage of these grants, and register for other assistance. at the meeting.

Neighbors who attended our March meeting about The Landing's plans for expansion may be interested in attending the **Planning Commission Policy sub-committee meeting, considering zoning issues related to this project, scheduled for September 14.** The Policy sub-committee will discuss whether to recommend a new 'special use' for Rural Residential (R-8) zoned land for age-restricted high density housing. Citizens attending this meeting may offer comments on this zoning matter, which would affect all areas within the county currently zoned R-8.

It is our Kingspoint tradition to **abstain from displaying political signs** on our properties, right of ways or at our community's entrance. See the **covenants page in your Directory** for more details about displaying signs.

You might enjoy Jamestown Jams, a series of free summer concerts at Jamestown Beach. The third concert in this series, on September 1 at 5:30 PM, will feature music from the 1990s from *Party of Four*. A final concert is planned for October.



Please be on the lookout for <u>fire ants</u> in your yard. Neighbors in the Crestwood Drive area have spotted them. These aggressive ants have a venomous bite which may require medical attention. They have moved north into our area in recent years. Fire ants need professional attention to completely destroy their nest.

Neighbors near the end of Overlook called to say that their **ornamental bamboo**, **planted near their mailbox**, **has mysteriously been cut**. When neighbors invest in planting something beautiful near the street, they don' expect others to cut or remove some part of their landscaping. We need to work together to prevent this from happening in future.

<u>Kingspoint: Preserving Our Clean</u> <u>Water Heritage</u>

Would you be interested in creating a rain garden in your yard, if you could recover up to \$500 of the costs through a grant ? Would you be interested if you had the help of master gardeners to design it for you? This assistance is available to you, to help manage storm water run-off and reduce erosion on your lot.

As we experience heavy, prolonged rainfall during major storms; erosion can create expensive problems on our steep lots in Kingspoint. JCC recently spent a little more than \$400,000 to fix an erosion problem in our neighborhood. County staff would like to work with us to protect our drainage infrastructure and to prevent future flooding and erosion problems in Kingspoint.

The Neighborhood Association has partnered with the Kingspoint Club, Inc., with county staff from the Stormwater and Environmental Protection Division, and with JCC Master Gardeners to bring you a program about **Preserving our Clean Water Heritage** on Monday, October 2, 2017, at 7:00 PM at the Clubhouse. We have a direct impact on water quality in our two lakes and on College Creek and Halfway Creek, all of which drain into the James River.

Several experts from James City County's Stormwater and Environmental Protection Division will speak with us about how we can prevent further erosion in our neighborhood, and also how each of us can help protect these important fresh water resources. We will learn how we can install rain gardens to collect and filter storm water, use native plants to create buffer zones, and maintain our fragile resource protection areas.

Master Gardener Bob Winters will speak about ways local Master Gardeners can help each of us, as we maintain our own property. He will highlight local programs such as Turf Love and Landscape Love.

In addition, there will be several displays of useful information and 'give-aways' provided by our county staff, local master gardeners, and other groups concerned with keeping our waterways clean. Light refreshments will be served.

Please mark October 2 on your calendar now to *save the date*, and plan to join us for this informative community gathering.


