KINGSPOINT GARDEN CLUB



Well, you never know what you will find when wandering in your garden. I discovered the above tree and could not figure out what it was. Andrew Koenig with Bartlett Tree Pruners helped me identify it. It is a red mulberry tree. Can't wait for it to grow more. This is what happens when you attract birds, they plant mysteries for you. My cherry tomatoes seem to have gotten yellow leaf blight so out they went. The banana and other peppers are doing great. They love this hot weather. I went out this morning to discover my ferns were turning into crisps, so out came the hose. I found a beautiful purple hose at Home Goods at a bargain. It makes a colorful addition to the garden. While it is nice to select native plants that do well in our area, when it is hot like this and we haven't had rain for a while a drink of water is appreciated by your garden.

Do your most work in the early morn or late afternoon. Relax in the shade during the day and enjoy your garden, unless it is too hot, then go indoors. Take Frequent breaks, keep hydrated, drink plenty of cool water and don't wait until you are thirsty to drink. Tie a wet kerchief around your neck, or drape a cotton dish towel around your neck. This works

almost as well as a cooling towel, per the experts, and saves money.

Gardening does not cease in the heat, and some weeding is necessary even when it is hot. Just as plants wilt in the afternoon sun so do gardeners. Wilting is a normal reaction to heat. The downward curved leaves revert to normal appearance when the temp goes down. If your hydrangea or other plants are still looking limp in the morning, then given them some water. If you like drip irrigation use an old hose that has a leak, drill little holes in it about an inch apart, and voila you have a drip hose. This beats recycling it or throwing it away.

For a little color, I planted some coleus and a portulaca near the door. Portulaca is an interesting plant with many colored flowers on the same plant and just loves hot weather. I also have elephant ears that are spreading in a sunny spot, as well as a hibiscus that is growing since I moved it from a shadier spot this spring.

KINGSPOINT NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION NEWS

Our Kingspoint community celebrates its 53rd anniversary this summer. The first lot sold on June 30, 1964, and that first home on Glenwood Drive was finished and ready for the Durham family the following December. By then, several more homes were in progress. Many original residents who built their homes in the 1960s and 1970s remain active in our community today.

We now have 228 homes in Kingspoint. Four are listed <u>for sale</u> and two remain under construction. In the early years, <u>The Kingspoint Corporation</u> guided our community's development. This small group of investors wrote our Kingspoint Covenants,

which follow the deed of each property; and also approved the plans for each new home. A few members of the corporation built and lived in Kingspoint during its early development.

When the Kingspoint Corporation turned our community over to the residents, they established the **Architectural Review**Committee to continue their work of guiding further development. This group of neighbors, led by Chairman Tim Caviness, approves all new construction and improvements or additions to existing homes in Kingspoint.

These community volunteers rarely receive any recognition or appreciation, and deserve both. Their judgment and discretion insures a level of consistency and quality that residents expect in our community. **Members of the ARC will gladly discuss building or renovation plans with you.** You'll find their contact information in the Kingspoint Directory.

With our children home from school for the summer, we are all more mindful when driving around the neighborhood. There are more walkers, pets, bikes and children playing outdoors than at any other time of year.

Please use special caution when entering Kingspoint Drive from Northpoint Drive and Crownpoint Road. Though no sign is posted, many of us stop and look before pulling out into this busy intersection.

Neighbors appreciate well-maintained shoulders along our streets. By late summer, the weeds grow lush in some areas, and present a hazard for walkers and children on bikes who need to move off the pavement to avoid traffic. Not only do these areas harbor chiggers, ticks and other wildlife; but poison ivy sometimes grows in the tangle.

Most of our neighbors maintain their yards right up to the pavement, which we all notice and appreciate very much, because it makes our neighborhood nicer for all.

We extend special appreciation to our front entrance volunteers, Tom Mahone and Chris Bonday, for their work to keep our Kingspoint Drive entrance neatly mown and maintained.

Your KPNA has hired a contractor to weed and spruce up the planting areas until **trees are planted and fresh mulch spread in late October.** We plan to replace the remaining Juniper shrubs with a fresh planting in autumn 2018.

Do you have old or unneeded household chemicals, paint or electronics to dispose of safely? The County's next Recycling Day at Warhill HS will be Saturday, August 12 from 8:00 AM until noon. Your next opportunity comes on October 14. Find details of what is accepted, and instructions for packaging the materials, at the VPPSA site.

State elections this fall bring the usual summer campaign season. It is our Kingspoint tradition to abstain from displaying political signs on our properties, right of ways or at our community's entrance. See the covenants page in your Directory for more details about displaying signs.

You might enjoy <u>Jamestown Jams</u>, a series of free summer concerts at <u>Jamestown Beach</u>. The second concert, on August 4 at 6:30 PM, will feature music from the 1980s with *The Deloreans*.

Neighborhood Watch

We enjoy a very safe and friendly neighborhood. Let's work together to make sure Kingspoint remains crime free this summer.

There are several 'No Soliciting' signs posted near our entrance, yet independent contractors still canvas our community from time to time looking for work. Please discourage this practice. While some of these visitors may be perfectly legitimate, others have pressured neighbors to hire them, or taken advantage in other ways.

Any person selling door to door must have a permit, issued by the JCC Police. The police do a background check on the individual, and check the credentials of their business, before issuing the permit.

If any solicitor makes you feel uncomfortable, don't hesitate to contact the JCC Police. *Hire only those contractors you know have good recommendations, insurance, and proper licensing.*

Vehicle break-ins continue in our region. You can discourage would-be thieves by keeping your car doors locked and valuables out of sight. Thieves look for spare change, electronics, bags and other tempting items when selecting a car to target.

Although it's rare, Kingspoint homes have been burglarized in recent years. Thieves entered through unlocked doors and windows. You can protect yourself and your home by keeping your doors, especially your garage door, and all accessible windows locked.

Our community service officers want to remind everyone that they will visit and complete **home safety audits** upon request. **A crime specialist will advise** you on locks, lighting, and other concerns. Police officers will also complete periodic house checks while you are traveling. Call 253-1800 to request these free services from our James City County police officers.

If you see something or someone suspicious, reach out to your Neighborhood Watch zone leader or call the JCC police. Get to know your neighbors.




