We invite families to enjoy an evening walk together to enjoy the many beautiful Christmas lights and holiday decorations in our community. We all can add a little light to the darkest nights of the season. The Garden Club's traditional community Christmas tree at Kingspoint and Woodbine Drive will still be lit during the holidays for our enjoyment. The Molineux family asked that the celebration be moved this one year due to new landscaping installed over the summer, which is not yet ready for foot traffic.

Volunteers have been hard at work at our neighborhood entrance over the past month. We appreciate their efforts, as always, to keep the grass trimmed, the leaves cleared away, and the litter picked up.

If you have more leaves than you can use, JCC will pick up leaves in our neighborhood one day between December 12 and 16. Leaves must be in clear plastic bags left at the curb before 8:00 AM. We don't know which day the truck will come, and they'll make only one trip this year. Bulky items, like limbs, won't be accepted. You may drop off your own bagged leaves at no charge at the Jolly Pond center now through mid-January.

We appreciate all of the contributions and membership support we have received from neighbors this fall. We can accomplish good things for our community when we work together. Our Treasurer, Kirsten Kellogg, will continue to accept contributions through the end of December from anyone who has not yet joined the KPNA. Every membership is important, especially as we begin our entrance renovation project and prepare for winter weather.

Our **entrance renovation starts in January** as we begin to remove some of the overgrown Leyland Cypress trees and complete needed pruning of hardwood trees in that area.

There are plans, again this year, to have snow deeper than 4" removed from those major streets which help neighbors get in and out of Kingspoint. We will publish more information on our website if a snow storm is forecast this winter.

The folks at VDOT assure us that **our access road project is still in queue**, although it has been delayed at bit. They still hope to complete it before the holidays. A dedicated right turn lane onto Rt.199 will help traffic flow leaving the neighborhood. VDOT has patched a number of pot holes for us recently, and **we've submitted work orders for more, which will be repaired soon.**

Contact any Board member if you find a pot hole in the neighborhood which as not yet been addressed. We've learned that VDOT evaluated all secondary pavement in the county this past year, in order to prioritize repaying projects, and their leadership is well aware that our streets need some major work.

Please extend a warm hand of friendship to Sarah and Jim Moore, and their daughter Lily, who moved into their new home at 107 Southpoint Drive last summer.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

As the holidays approach, let's work together to keep ourselves, our guests, our homes, and our neighbors protected from unexpected difficulties.

Following is a short list of reminders gleaned from MPO Alan McDowell's much longer list of <u>Holiday Safety Tips</u>, which you will find on the KPNA website.

- 1. Keep purchases and packages out of sight. This includes keeping purchases locked in your car's trunk, bringing deliveries indoors promptly, and keeping Christmas gifts and packaging out of sight from the street. Don't leave any valuables in your car, which might tempt someone to break in to get them.
- 2. Make sure doors and windows are locked, both at home and on your vehicle, including garage doors. Be very cautious of strangers approaching your home or your car. Notice anything that seems odd or unusual, or makes you uncomfortable.
- 3. Notice who and what is around as you approach your car in parking lots. Park in well lit areas, away from large vehicles.
- 4. **Consider putting interior and exterior lights on timers** if you will be away from home. Ask a neighbor to check on your home if you'll be away more than a few days.
- 5. **Remain alert for scams.** Don't give out your personal information easily, especially over the phone; and direct charitable giving to known, reputable groups.

<u>Clubhouse Entrance</u> <u>Patio Bricks</u>

The past few years we have welcomed many new families to the Kingspoint community. These families may not have thought about or known how to order a brick for the Clubhouse entrance. When we built the Clubhouse we conducted a "Fundraiser" that generated money to furnish the clubhouse. At that time we offered bricks with personal messages, and benches, trees, etc. and raised over \$20,000! This time we are ordering only bricks. Personal messages have honored families, children, grandchildren, neighbors, former residents, individuals, who have passed on, and pets. For many of us it has served as a way to remember all the wonderful neighbors who make Kingspoint what it is. This is also a way to show your pride in your swimmers!

Ordering a brick is very simple and easy. We charge \$100.00 for a "STANDARD" brick (4"x8") which allows 15 characters per line (including spaces) and 4 lines of text. (Call me if you want a larger brick, 8"x 8".)

- 1. Check out bricks in the patio to get an idea for your brick.
- 2. Give me a call and I will help you with the wording. (The website where I order has a "brick creator" where I can make a digital brick and email it to you.) This is a very simple process that allows you to see what you are getting.
- 3. Send a check made out to me, Robert Hanny, for \$100.00. I will order your brick, pay for it and when your brick arrives I will cash your check and send the balance, usually \$60.00 to the club, (less my expense which includes the brick and shipping). A standard brick usually costs \$40.00 depending on how many bricks are in an order.
- 4. Bricks are usually shipped and received in 3-4 weeks. Weather permitting, I then install the brick.




