KINGSPOINT NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION NEWS

Spring is finally in the air, and we are looking forward to time spent with family and friends enjoying our favorite outdoor activities.

Many neighbors are already hard at work, cleaning up what winter left behind in our yards. Our neighbors appreciate every small effort we each make to keep our community looking neat and well maintained.

April is Spring Clean-up Month across our area. Let's work together to hold our own spring cleanup here in Kingspoint this month. There is still time to apply to our local Master Gardeners for help through their <u>Landscape</u> Love and Turf Love programs.

You may request a county truck to pick up large debris such as discarded furniture, appliances, old stumps and tree trunks, yard waste, and other bulky refuse for a \$75.00 fee. Contact Jim Hill at 565-0971 to make an appointment, and find more information here. You may drop most of these things off yourself at the Jolly Pond Road facility. Many items, such as old grills, propane tanks, scrap metal and lawnmowers; can be dropped off for free.

As we each go about our spring cleaning, we may decide to hold a yard sale to clear out perfectly good items no longer needed by our family. The Neighborhood Association will sponsor a **Kingspoint Yard Sale Day** on **Saturday, May 5 from 8-2,** if enough families express interest.

By working together to stage a **Kingspoint** Yard Sale Day, we can advertise widely and attract shoppers interested in visiting several different sales across the neighborhood. By scheduling our yard sales all on the same day, we minimize traffic and disruption in the community through the remainder of the season. Many of us enjoy visiting and chatting

with our neighbors as we visit one another's yard sales.

Families who register will be included on a neighborhood map, with a list of the types of items they plan to sell. These maps will be available to neighbors and visitors, at our entrance, on the day of the yard sale. The Neighborhood Association will also provide balloons to mark each site, will post signs and will arrange advertising with local media. The DAV is sending a truck to pick up those items left at the end of the day that families wish to donate.

We will need at least a dozen registrations by April 14, to go ahead with plans for a Kingspoint Yard Sale Day. If we don't have sufficient interest by that day, we will return all registration fees. You will find further details and a registration form on our KPNA website.

We all appreciate Harvey and Peggy Manning and Tim Murphy for delivering all of the new 2018 directories last month. It takes a team effort to produce a directory each year, and we truly appreciate neighbors reaching out to update their contact information.

Our Neighborhood Association volunteers continue to spruce up our entrance. Many thanks to Gary Gordon for his beautifully crafted posts to protect the grass we are nurturing at the entrance, and for his continued efforts to keep the leaves blown. He is working with Ann Hobson to prepare our new trees, shrubs, and grass for spring.

Thanks also to Chris Bonday and Tom Mahone for all of their hard work to keep our entrance mown, trimmed and neat.

We are working with VDOT to keep our neighborhood streets in good shape. They continue to promptly repair holes in the pavement as we report them. We also continue to advocate for re-paving of all of our neighborhood streets. While we don't have a

time line for this project yet, KPNA Board members regularly bring it to the attention of our local VDOT residency.

James City County sponsors an Annual Spring Cleanup each April. More than seven million pounds of trash have been collected from public spaces by volunteers over the years. The Clean County Commission will sponsor this year's Annual Spring Cleanup on April 14.

Litter collected as part of the **40th Annual** Countywide Spring Cleanup may be disposed of for free at the Jolly Pond Transfer Station located at 1204 Jolly Pond Road between 7 AM and 4 PM on April 14, 2018 Register online if you, or your group, plans to participate this year.

The next Household Chemical Collection Day is April 14 from 8 AM until noon at Warhill High School. You may drop off many household, garden and automotive products at no charge, including compact fluorescent light bulbs and some consumer electronics.

A Shred-A-Thon, sponsored by our county police department is scheduled for May 19 from 8:30 to 11:30 AM at the courthouse on Monticello Avenue. The first bag is free, and additional bags will cost \$5 each to drop off. Proceeds go to support community outreach activities. Please check the details if you plan to participate.

With warmer weather ahead, we all look forward to getting outside to enjoy the many pleasures of living in Kingspoint.

Kingspoint Plant of the Month: Narcissus



Are you wondering what you can plant in your yard that will thrive in our unique situation, and will survive despite our hungry deer? We will highlight plants that have proven "Kingspoint Tough" and contribute to the beauty of our community.

Golden and white *Narcissus* greet us as soon as the weather begins to warm each spring. They first appear in February and nod in the breeze until May. Despite their beautiful flowers, these tough perennials are entirely poisonous, if eaten. Grazing animals won't touch them. Their roots won't be nibbled by voles.

Narcissus, often called daffodils or jonquils, come from bulbs planted in late autumn. Once established, they continue to divide and spread each year. These easy and long-lived perennials will tolerate our heavy clay and benefit from summer's heat and dry soil.

The trick to keeping *Narcissus* productive is allowing their leaves to mature before cutting them back. The leaves fuel the bulb for next season's flowers and should be left standing until they turn yellow and die back naturally. *Narcissus* need full sun only in the spring, before most trees leaf out, and can be planted under and around other perennial plants.

You will find hundreds of varieties of *Narcissus* bulbs available each fall, and all of them will thrive in our neighborhood.


