#### NO MORE MULCH VOLCANOS

There has been an outbreak of mulch volcanos in the Williamsburg area. Piling a lot of mulch up around the base of a tree keeps the

bark of the tree wet and sets up an environment for insects and diseases to move in. Mulch should be pushed back several inches from the base of the tree. But, spreading mulch around the base of the tree is very beneficial. It prevents competition from weeds and grass and helps to conserve moisture in the soil. Also it protects trees from accidental damage by mowers and weed whackers. 2 to 4 inches of mulch is plenty.

This anonymous 'drive through' event, held in cooperation with the DEA, allows county residents to properly dispose of solid (pills or capsules) prescription drugs. No questions will be asked. Liquids, sharps, OTC drugs and illegal drugs cannot be accepted.

A Shred a Thon, sponsored by our county police department is scheduled for May 19 from 8:30 to 11:30 AM at the courthouse on Monticello Avenue. The first bag is free, and additional bags will cost \$5 each to drop off. Proceeds go to support community outreach activities. Please check the details if you plan to participate.

Our county's Emergency Management team is responsible to prepare for any sort of weather or other emergency that might affect our community. You may sign up for either texts or emailed emergency alerts, and can <u>customize</u> your settings to receive only those of interest to you at **jccalert.org.** 

However, the National Weather Service has access to send out their own messages over this system. In addition, they can send alerts about potentially life threatening situations to all residential phones in affected areas, whether or not the resident subscribes to the alert service. Local officials are working with the NWS to limit alerts sent after 10 PM at night. This is becoming a nationwide issue, when the alert system is activated at night during severe storms.



#### **Kingspoint Plant of the Month: Dogwood**

Our native dogwood, *Cornus florida*, illuminates our community with its white or pink blossoms each April. This beautiful understory tree thrives in sun to partial shade, and is interesting every day of the year. April flowers are followed by attractive leaves which turn scarlet in autumn. Red berries appear by late summer, and in winter, gnarled branches hold the buds for next spring's flowers. Graceful and exceptionally strong, dogwoods only reach 20'-30' tall. They are rarely damaged by high winds.

Dogwoods support a variety of wildlife as pollinators seek nectar, and songbirds find shelter and feed on their berries. They serve as host plants for over 100 species of butterflies and moths. Dogwood is the state tree and state flower of Virginia, and is also the Virginia Native Plant Society's Wildflower of the Year for 2018.

Dogwood trees rarely interest grazing deer and have adjusted to our soil and climate, often cropping up in the garden from nature-sown seeds. You will also find other dogwood species available at some garden centers, including the native *Cornus alternifolia*, *Cornus amomum*, and cultivars of the Asian *Cornus kousa*, which bloom a little later in the spring.

Plant a dogwood tree with confidence, knowing it will survive and thrive in our neighborhood!
