1) **Pool Hours** - Regular summer pool hours are now in effect:

Monday-Saturday from 10am-8pm;

Sunday from 12noon-8pm.

The pool will open at 10:00 a.m. on July 4th and Labor Day. The pool will close earlier (approx. 4 p.m.) on home swim meet days (6/25, 7/2).

2) Free Clubhouse Rental (half-day) – The free clubhouse reservation for KP Club members begins July 1. All resident club members will receive one free half-day (up to 4 hours) clubhouse rental each calendar year. Reservations for the free rental can be made no more than 30 days in advance. In other words, if you want to reserve the clubhouse for an August 15th social gathering, you would need to wait until July 15th to book. This is to ensure that groups who pay to reserve the clubhouse many months in advance are ensured there will be some open dates. To check available dates and submit a reservation request, first go to the Clubhouse website to check the updated calendar. We make every effort to update the calendar as quickly as possible, but there may still be times when a reservation is on the books but not yet updated in the online calendar. KINGSPOINT NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION NEWS

Thank you for your patience, contributions and support as we renovate the landscape at our entrance. We intend to complete the project in October when we remove the remaining Juniper shrubs and replace them with 87 additional Yaupon hollies. Soon, native hollies will grow along the bank in a solid mass, as the Junipers have grown in years passed.

The new Magnolia tree bloomed earlier this summer, and the new holly trees are all filling in. We appreciate the generous contributions from neighbors that allowed us to plant these beautiful new trees and shrubs last year. Ann Hobson is caring for them all, keeping them watered in dry spells and applying deer repellent as they establish. As a newly minted Tree Steward, Ann has also been pruning the older shrubs and trees to improve their health and appearance.

Colonial Gardens, who planted the first of the Yaupon hollies last December, is working with our KPNA Board to complete the renovation of our entrance this fall. As you might expect, this final part of the project will require a major financial investment to plant so many shrubs at once. We trust that we can count on the community's continued financial support.

We intend to apply for a \$500 matching grant through James City County this August to help with our re-planting expenses. Kingspoint has received this grant twice already since 2015. County staff is aware of our plans and it's possible that we'll receive this assistance one more time, as we finish our entrance renovation.

Our Neighborhood Association volunteers continue work at our entrance. Many thanks to Chris Bonday, Tom Mahone, Ann Hobson and Gary Gordon for their work this summer. Everyone's efforts to keep litter picked up and to maintain their yards and roadside shoulders demonstrates how much we love and care for our neighborhood.

If you would like to learn more about our local county government, the next JCC Neighborhood Forum will be July 11 at 6:30 P.M. JCC residents meet together bi-monthly at the recreation Center on Longhill Road. Police Chief Rinehimer will speak and answer questions. This is a friendly forum for county residents to meet with staff and Supervisors.

The annual Shred a Thon, sponsored by the JCC Police, will be July 28, from 8:30 to 11:30 AM at the courthouse on Monticello Avenue. The first bag is free, and additional bags will cost \$5 each to drop off. Proceeds go to support community outreach activities. Please check the details if you plan to participate.

Summer parking fees at Jamestown Beach are charged to non-residents beginning on Memorial Day weekend. You may pick up a free proof of residency decal for your vehicle at several Parks and Recreation locations, including at Jamestown Beach. Decals issued in previous years remain valid.

Fireworks

The **summer celebrations** are important to all of us, and many of us have visitors this time of year. We are looking forward to the public Fourth of July special events and fireworks displays in our area.

As a reminder, the use, possession, display, sale or storage of <u>fireworks</u> is illegal in **James City County.** This includes fireworks that were legally purchased elsewhere. Anyone wishing to set off personal fireworks must first obtain a permit from the Fire Marshal.

Individuals who have purchased, or are in possession of fireworks, are encouraged to **turn them in at any county fire station**, or call the Fire Marshal's office at <u>757-220-0626</u> for assistance. Anyone <u>voluntarily surrendering fireworks will not be criminally charged.</u> We are all aware of the serious injuries and property damage caused by accidents with fireworks.

Yard Signs

Please remember that our covenants prohibit most signs posted in neighborhood yards. This includes advertisements, signs left by contractors doing work on our homes and political signs. Please help to maintain the peace and beauty of our 'yard sign free' community. See Covenant #4 at the back of your Kingspoint Directory for details.

dates so they can keep an eye on your home while you're traveling. Most of us remember to stop mail and paper deliveries, but neighbors can help out if deliveries come, anyway.

Our James City County police will also keep a watch on your home, especially at night, if you plan an extended trip. This is a free service and must be set up in advance by contacting the Police Department at 757-259-5140, Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. You may also submit your request for 'House Checks' using the online Police to Citizen (P2C) system.

Police officers will visit your home or JCC business to perform a security audit or lighting audit. They will give you suggestions for making your property more secure. This is a free service that may be scheduled by contacting the same number or website above.

Zone leaders keep in touch with the neighbors in their area, relaying information about specific concerns to other zone leaders or the police. They are also prepared to reach out to their immediate neighbors with information that we need to share across the neighborhood quickly. Zone leaders also visit and greet new neighbors to share information about the community with them. This is the perfect job for friendly people who want to be involved with the community.

Kingspoint Plant of the Month:

Magnolia

Magnolia trees' white, fragrant flowers announce summer as they perfume the air. Yet they look cool and inviting on the steamiest summer day. Their evergreen leaves persist all winter and are used in holiday decorations.

Native in the Southeast, *Magnolia grandiflora* originated in the coastal Carolinas south to Florida and west to Texas. These stately trees now grow across a much broader range around the world.

The *Magnolia grandiflora* is a large tree, requiring a large space and lots of sun. It can eventually grow to nearly 100 ft. tall and 40' wide, depending on the cultivar. Long-lived and versatile, Magnolias thrive in a variety of conditions. They have few pests or other problems, but they do create dense shade and drop leaves year round.

Magnolias are a good tree for wildlife. Their flowers attract pollinators and birds devour their seeds. Their sturdy canopy provides shelter.

When shopping, look for improved cultivars, like *M. 'Bracken's Brown Beauty'* if space is a concern; or consider the native Sweet Bay Magnolia, *M. Virginiana*, that has a more shrubby habit and grows to only 20' tall and wide.

Many Kingspoint neighbors already enjoy Magnolias in their gardens. Plant Magnolia trees with confidence, knowing they will survive and thrive in our neighborhood.




