### KINGSPOINT PLANT OF THE MONTH: IRIS



Iris are named after the Greek goddess of the rainbow for their many beautiful colors. Their colorful flowers and delicious fragrance delight us. German bearded hybrid Iris bloom for a few weeks in late April to early May, and their distinctive, evergreen leaves persist

all year. Re-blooming hybrids are particularly vigorous and can bloom again in the fall.

Iris want full to partial sun and don't demand much attention. They grow on many types of soil, including our clay, but appreciate a little soil prep and annual feeding. Remove their bloom stalks after the flowers all fade and divide them every few years if they seem congested. Water during drought will help them along, but they have a reputation for persisting on their own.

Iris are 'pass along plants,' and gardeners with Iris often have divisions to share. Buy established plants or divisions, not seeds, as many Iris are hybrids. Iris leaves are too tough to interest deer or rabbits, and the flowers' fragrance warns them off. Even Iris planted near the street will grow untouched, delighting passers-by each spring.

Many Kingspoint neighbors grow the species Iris pallida, a light blue or white bearded Iris originally brought to Virginia by the colonists and found in Colonial Williamsburg gardens. The flower is a little narrower than the hybrids, but many prefer its simplicity and appreciate its vigor.

There are many types of Iris that grow well in our region. The newly renovated Iris Border at the Williamsburg Botanical Garden in Freedom Park includes numerous species and Iris hybrids, including Virginia natives, that extend the Iris season from February through December. You may find an interesting Iris blooming there that you would enjoy growing at home.

Plant Iris with confidence, knowing they will survive and thrive in our neighborhood.

### SHRED-A-THON 2019

Join James City County Police Department for a Shred-A-Thon on May 4 at the Williamsburg/James City County Courthouse at 5201 Monticello Avenue, Williamsburg, 8:30-11:30 a.m. or when the truck is full.

The first grocery bag of documents will be shredded at no charge and each additional bag will be \$5. Citizens are invited to bring up to 10 paper or plastic grocery bags or 5 file boxes of documents to be shredded.

### JCSA WATER METER REGISTER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

The James City Service Authority (JCSA) has begun a comprehensive <u>water meter register replacement</u> program to replace all touch read registers with radio read registers. The county has hired Texas based Professional Meters, Inc., to install these upgraded devices in existing meters.

There is no pre-determined schedule of when neighborhoods will receive the replacement equipment, but PMI is expected to give residents some notice before work begins. Technicians must have access to your water meter to complete the work. Water will be shut off temporarily, while the upgrade is completed, at each address.
