The holiday season is quickly approaching, and we would love to continue a holiday tradition with all of you. Please join The Kingspoint Club in

celebrating this holiday season by lining our neighborhood with candle luminaries. Help us transform our neighborhood into a beautiful winter village on **Sunday**, **December 15**th, **from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm.**

The luminaries consist of a votive candle placed in 2-3 inches of sand inside a white paper bag. Participating families line the street in front of their house and if desired, their driveways and walkways, too. The luminaries are placed approximately three to five feet apart and everyone lights their candles at 5:00pm. We should have (weather permitting) several hours to enjoy the impressive sight! If you will not be home to light your candles, but you wish to participate, a neighbor can light your candles for you.

Kingspoint Plant of the Month: Christmas Fern

Our native Christmas fern earns its name by remaining evergreen throughout the winter when many other ferns have disappeared. Its deep

green fronds persist in woods and other shady areas, often appearing on steep slopes and in other undisturbed areas of our yards.

Growing to about 18" tall, *Polystichum* acrostichoides forms dense clumps, growing a bit broader each year. Fronds emerge from a central point in the fern to form a vase shaped mass. Its dense roots are useful to hold soil in areas that might otherwise erode. The rhizomes don't spread very much, but new ferns may appear nearby from windblown spores. This fern is reasonably drought tolerant once established. Plant in full to partial shade.

The Christmas fern can be found from Canada south to Florida and west to Texas. It is one of the most common native ferns in our area and requires very little care, other than cutting back older fronds in the spring. It has few pest problems and is rarely grazed by deer or rabbits.

Use Christmas ferns in naturalized plantings, on slopes, along paths or mixed with shrubs in a foundation planting. You can find young Christmas ferns in some garden centers now, or in early spring. Plant this fern with confidence that it will survive and thrive in our neighborhood.

FYI LEAF DISPOSAL

James City County residents may drop off leaves in clear leaf sized bags free of charge Nov. 11-24, 2019 and Jan. 6-19, 2020 at the Jolly Pond Convenience Center, 1204 Jolly Pond Road. The Convenience Center is open daily from 7 a.m.-5 p.m. Resident may also pick up bagged leaves, at no charge, to use for personal composting. At the Jolly Pond Convenience Center. The county will pick up leaves in our neighborhood between December 2 and 6. Please have your leaves at the curb in clear yard waste bags by 8 AM on December 2, if you want them collected.

Leaves may also be shredded and left in place or used as mulch. This helps improve our clay soil, protects shrubs and perennials from frost heave, and helps prevent erosion. Burning isn't permitted in residential areas of James City County.

NOTES FROM NEIGHBORS

While many Kingspoint neighbors love animals, and especially their pets, two concerns have come up this month that merit sharing in the Crier.

First, concern has been expressed about dogs left out of doors to bark for long periods of time in the early morning and evening hours. Since sound travels so clearly through ravines and across water, many neighbors hear a barking dog from blocks away. Consideration is requested so that dogs aren't barking when neighbors may be resting, and that dogs aren't left outside to bark for long periods of time.

Secondly, we have had sightings of foxes and possums in the neighborhood this month. We know that many animals come into our yards at night, especially where water and food are available. Please be cautious if your pets are outside after dark or early in the morning, and remain mindful of the dangers they may face.
