#### LETTER FROM THE KP PRESIDENTS

We hope that everyone in the Kingspoint Community has been able to stay cool throughout the severe heat we have been feeling in recent days. Having the pool open has helped tremendously, so we are thankful that you have all been so understanding of the COVID-related policies we have in place to ensure we operate as safely as possible. As we mentioned in Club-wide correspondence, we are abiding by the guidance set forth in the Phase Three update of Virginia's Safer At Home guidelines. The Clubhouse is also available for use by contacting Ruth Ann.

As a reminder, the pool continues to operate during the hours highlighted in our July 8th email. The Kingspoint Swim Team will wrap up their abbreviated season in just a couple of weeks, so we will send an early August email that provides updated pool hours for the rest of the summer.

We are now in quarter three of the calendar so we are starting to get a better handle on what our operating revenue and costs are for the year. Our revenue is down since we are seeing less clubhouse rentals and a reduced number of non-resident memberships. Some expenses will be reduced for 2020, but not to the extent that they offset the lost revenue. For those paying quarterly, the third quarter payments were due at the start of July. Fourth quarter payments will be due at the start of October. Timely payments are more important than ever as we continue to review our 2020 budget outlook.

We are so thankful for having such a supportive and caring neighborhood. The past months have been very strange for all of us, but our sense of community, even when we have to social distance, has helped Kingspoint families stay connected. Thank you all for that, and thank you for your continued support through these unique times.

The Kingspoint Club, Inc. oversees our community's recreational property on Northpoint Drive. This waterfront site includes a beautiful clubhouse, neighborhood pool, picnic area, dock, and a children's play area. The KP Club operates the pool and clubhouse and organizes neighborhood social events for members. Membership in the Club is optional for residents, and includes use of the pool, boat ramp and dock. Members may also rent the clubhouse and pool for social events. Membership is required to attend some Club sponsored social events. Non-residents may also pay annual dues to use the pool and the clubhouse. For more information or to join, contact Gina Flango, ginaflango@gmail.com.

### Voting

Ballots for the November election will begin to be issued at the end of September.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we encourage all James City County Voters to Vote from Home by absentee ballot. Here are your options for obtaining an application or making your request:

• If you have a Virginia issued DMV I.D., complete an absentee application online. Visit vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation. Follow the prompts for requesting an absentee ballot. Please note the instructions regarding social distancing for your

selections when choosing an absentee option and absentee reason.

- Or print, complete and sign a paper absentee application. Return by mail to: JCC Office of Elections and Voter Registration, 5300 Palmer Lane, Williamsburg, VA 23188, by fax at 757- 259-4945, or by scanned attachment email: vote@jamescitycountyva.gov. You are required to ensure the completed application reaches this office.
- Or call 757-259-4949 and request an absentee ballot application be mailed to you. Applications may also be printed from the link below.
