LETTER FROM THE KP PRESIDENTS

Thank you to Kingspoint Club members for working with us during Phase Two. So far it seems that the pool and clubhouse openings have gone smoothly. On July 1st, the state will move to Phase Three. At this time the board will evaluate what changes in our policies will need to be made with this transition. Please keep an eye out for an email from the Kingspoint Club in a few days with additional information regarding pool and clubhouse use. If you have not received email from the Kingspoint Club presidents account, please be sure to send your email to kppresidents@gmail.com so that we can add you to our mailing list.

We met with Continental Pools (our pool management company) last week, and they wanted to emphasize that social distancing of 10 feet is required between individuals who are not in the same family group. Because of COVID-19 concerns, the Health Department has been making visits to pools and citing pools that fail to maintain proper social distancing. So please, in the interest of keeping our pool open all summer long, keep 10 feet of space between you and people not living in your home. Social distancing must occur both in the pool and on the pool deck. If you are asked by a life guard or Kingspoint resident to maintain social distance, please kindly comply. Also, while we no longer require individuals under 18 to be accompanied by an adult, our pool contract requires individuals under the age of 14 have an adult with them on the pool deck.

Water aerobics will be returning next week to the Kingspoint pool. We will have water aerobics every Tuesday and Friday mornings, beginning 30 June from 10:30-11:30AM. Classes are open to all KP Club Members and there is no charge to you.

Our instructor this year is Bambi Walters. She comes highly recommended by our previous instructors Meg Webber and Kathy Royal. Bambi is certified to teach water aerobics, zumba and also is CPR certified. She currently teaches at Windsor Meade and the Spa at Colonial Williamsburg, and has also taught Silver Sneakers classes at the JCC Rec Center. She is very interested in making sure you get a good workout, while also having a good time.

We will be taking signups for the first week for the first 18 participant slots. You can reserve yours at https://www.signupgenius.com/go/20f0945a9a62ca4fa7-water Afterwards, we will admit on a first come/first serve basis until we reach capacity.

A couple things to keep in mind:

- Lane lines will be in the pool and participants staggered to ensure proper social distancing.
- No shared equipment (pool noodles, weights, etc) will be used during class.

- Masks are not required in the pool.
- Class is scheduled for 1 hour, but instructor will adjust to needs of participants (meaning, the first classes may be a little shorter or include more stretching/yoga).
- In case of rain/pool closure, we will try to use Monday mornings as a makeup day.
- Classes should run through August/early Sept. There may be a one week break in August that will be announced well in advance.
- All participants must be KP Club Members in good standing and up-to-date on annual dues. If you need a non resident membership form, please let me know. The fees are the same as last year.

Several excellent arborists work in Kingspoint.

Independence Day is only a few weeks away. As a reminder, the use, possession, display, sale or storage of fireworks is illegal in James City County. This includes fireworks that were legally purchased elsewhere. Anyone wishing to set off personal fireworks must first obtain a permit from the Fire Marshal.

Individuals who have purchased, or are in possession of fireworks, are encouraged to turn them in at any county fire station, or call the Fire Marshal's office at 757-220-0626 for assistance. Anyone voluntarily surrendering fireworks will not be criminally charged. We are all aware of the serious injuries and property damage caused by accidents with fireworks.

Although we don't yet know whether our many traditional community celebrations will be able to go on this year, we do know that the sounds of fireworks or weapons may be troubling to many. Let's work together to maintain our peaceful, neighborly community so that it feels safe and welcoming for all.

Stay well, and please remember to look out for your neighbors and their needs. We are all stronger when we work together.
