
## Little Dolphins

# Leaf Disposal

James City County residents may drop off leaves in clear leaf sized bags free of charge Nov. 14-22, 2020 and Jan. 9-17, 2021 at the Jolly Pond Convenience Center, 1204 Jolly Pond Road. The Convenience Center is open daily from 7 am-5 pm. Residents may also pick up bagged leaves, at no charge, to use for personal composting. At the Jolly Pond Convenience Center.

There will be one round of curbside leaf collection, scheduled for December 9-16 in our voting district. Leaves must be in clear plastic bags (40 gallons or less). Bagged leaves should be left curbside by 8 am on the first day of collection in each district. Each street will be collected one time only. Bulky materials such as brush and tree limbs cannot be accepted.

Leaves may also be shredded and left in place or used as mulch. This helps improve our clay soil, protects shrubs and perennials from frost heave, and helps prevent erosion. Burning isn't permitted in residential areas of James City County.

# Feeding Deer Prohibited in JCC September 1 - January 4

Effective September 1st each year it is illegal to feed deer statewide in Virginia. This coincides with deer hunting season. Feeding deer during hunting season is considered 'baiting,' whether the individual feeding them hunts or not. The annual prohibition runs through

the first Saturday in January in most of the state, including James City County and the City of Williamsburg.

Problems with feeding deer: "Feeding deer can unnaturally increase deer populations and damage natural habitats, increase the likelihood for disease transmission, increase human-deer conflicts such as deer/vehicle collisions, and diminish the wild nature of deer. Fed deer are often emboldened to seek human foods, leading them into conflict with people. Feeding deer leads to the prolonged crowding of animals in a small area, resulting in more direct animal to animal contact, contamination of feeding sites, and greater risk of disease transmission." VA Dept. of Game and Inland Fisheries

Report Wildlife Violations: "It is clear that the negative consequences of feeding deer outweigh the benefits. If anyone sees or suspects someone of illegally feeding deer during this time period ... please report it to DGIF's Wildlife Crime Line at 1-800-237-5712."

Saturday, October 31. Families who aren't participating should leave their porch lights off. Those with yard lights near the street are encouraged to leave them burning, to make it brighter and safer for those out celebrating.

Some of you may be aware of the dam that separates a Kingspoint lake from Halfway Creek, located behind private property on Overlook Drive. The wooded lot on the other side of the dam is also private property. Erosion has been a problem here for many years, and county staff determined this week that the dam is no longer safe for foot traffic due to the erosion. The barrier with tape and stakes was constructed by staff from the Stormwater and Resource Protection Division, who are the professionals who work with us on all Resource Protection Areas on our properties.

We appreciate the support of everyone who has joined the Neighborhood Association and renewed their membership this fall. Our Treasurer, Brandy Belue, will gratefully accept your membership contributions through the end of the year. We depend on volunteer effort and voluntary contributions from neighbors to keep up our initiatives on behalf of all Kingspoint residents.



We are always happy to welcome neighbors who want to work with us on various projects. Please reach out to any Board member if you or a family member can volunteer. We have an ongoing list of neighbors with chainsaws and rakes, willing to help clear fallen trees during and after storms. Our Neighborhood Association volunteers continue work at our entrance. Thanks to Chris Bonday and Tom Mahone for their hard work to keep our entrance mowed, trimmed and neat, and to Ann Hobson for her work with our new trees and shrubs.

# The College Creek Marina Project Update

Many, many thanks to everyone who showed up for the hearing last Wednesday, and to those who left voice messages that were played during the hearing. Kingspoint neighbors brought tremendous expertise and first hand information that convinced two members of the board to vote against the proposal. With a 2-2 vote, the request was denied.

According to Mike Woolson, Secretary to the Chesapeake Bay Board, the only appeal to that decision is for Mr. Waltrip to sue the CBB in court. The two parts of the project that were approved by the Wetlands Board in September, a small retaining wall and a catwalk beside the current boat ramp, may go forward. We are still waiting for a hearing to be scheduled before the VMRC on the parts of the marina project that could be built out over College Creek. Thanks to everyone who has been involved in this enormous team effort to protect College Creek.


