- 7. Below is a sample of the steps to follow on the Kingspoint Club Electronic Invoice Email.
 - (a) Open the invoice email and select Review and pay.
 - (b) Select the Edit amount icon to edit the Payment Amount.
 - (c) Enter the partial amount.
 - (d) Complete the rest of the fields and select Pay.
- 8. The Treasurer will be emailing a second round of electronic invoices on May 1, 2022.
- 9. Mail kppresidents@gmail.com if you have questions about the Quickbooks process or you would like to receive a paper invoice in the 2022 season.

Lifeguard Training

If you are interested in becoming a lifeguard, Continental is offering training and certification for the 2022 pool season. Fees are \$35 for new certifications and \$25 for recertification.

Applicants must meet the following requirements: Be at least 15 years old Swim a distance of 100 yards using crawl or breaststroke without resting Feet-first dive, retrieve a 10-pound brick from a minimum depth of 8 feet, and bring it to the surface Tread water without using arms for 1 minute
