- 6. Local grandchildren are free.
- 7. All other local guests are \$5 per person (Note: Kingspoint residents that are not club members cannot be guests).
- 8. Please use the "pay box" at the lifeguard stand.

Lifeguards: We will only have one lifeguard during most weekdays this summer. This means there will be 45 minutes of guarded free swim every hour, followed by the last 15 minutes of each hour being adults only/swim at own risk. Please plan pool arrival time accordingly. We do expect to have two lifeguards on weekends and holidays.

Non-Resident Memberships: Know anyone in Williamsburg interested in joining the Kingspoint pool? Club memberships for non-residents are available and they include summer access to the pool. Rates HAVE NOT changed in 2022. Rates are \$285 for a single person or \$360 for a family. The pool opens on Memorial Day weekend. Non-Resident Club memberships are a great way to increase revenue for the KP Club, so let local friends and families know that we are accepting applications.

The Clubhouse: The KP Clubhouse is open for business and fun! Our Clubhouse can be rented by both members and non-members. (All stockholder members get one free 1/2 day rental each year AND all KP Club members get reduced rental rates.) Spread the word that our wonderful facility is available for rent with the best rates in town. The clubhouse has wonderful views and great amenities.
